- Superintendent Jack Smith released his \$2.52 billion operating budget recommendation for Fiscal Year (FY) 2018 during a presentation to the Board of Education on December 13. The budget calls for a 2.5 percent increase in spending that will allow the district to manage significant enrollment growth and build the foundation and structure that is needed to ensure that all MCPS students are able to achieve at higher levels.

Be sure to share your ideas and views on the importance of funding the MCPS operating budget with our elected Montgomery County officials—the Montgomery County Board of Education, the County Executive, and the Montgomery County Council—through emails, letters, and testimonials. The Board of Education will be holding two public hearings on the budget recommendation: the first is Thursday, January 5; the second is Wednesday, January 11. Both hearings will be held at 7:00 p.m. in the auditorium of the Carver Educational Services Center.

Montgomery County Executive Isiah Leggett will be holding forums this month to seek input from residents about the county's FY 2018 budget priorities. The first two are scheduled for Monday, January 9, and Wednesday, January 11. Both forums will run from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m.

January 9 forum will be held at the Bethesda-Chevy Chase Regional Services Center located at 4805 Edgemoor Lane in Bethesda. The January 11 forum will take place at the Eastern Montgomery Regional Services Center located at 3300 Briggs Chaney Road in Silver Spring.

The three remaining forums are scheduled for January 18, 25, and 30 at locations across Montgomery County.

The County Executive will announce his Recommended FY 2018 Operating Budget on March 15. In April, the County Council will hold public hearings and approve the operating budget at the end of May.

- **Provide Comment on Student Transfer Policy.** The Montgomery County Board of Education is seeking your comments on tentative changes to Board Policy JEE, *Student Transfers*. This policy outlines when students may be granted a transfer to attend a school other than their home or assigned school. Among the revisions to the policy is an update to the lottery system for enrollment in language immersion programs. The revised lottery would apply to students seeking to enroll in these programs for the 2018–2019 school year. **This change would not impact families with students enrolled in the immersion programs during the 2017–2018 school year.** Policy JEE is available for public comment until Friday, February 3, 2017.
