Parents and their students who are interested in participating in the Bells Mill Science Fair are encouraged to attend Help Night for guidance in the selection of an age-appropriate project and to learn tips for science fair success. The annual Science Fair is on Friday, May 5, 6:45-8:00 pm, in the APR. The Science Fair is non-competitive and open to all students in Grades K-5. Participation is voluntary.

Registration for a limited number of openings for Head Start eligible children, residing in certain areas of Germantown, Rockville, and Takoma Park, who will be 3 by September 1, 2017, also begins March 10. Parents may apply at Rocking Horse Center, 4910 Macon Rd, Rockville, Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Walk-ins are welcome, but appointments are available if preferred. - The Montgomery County Board of Education has recommended a \$2.52 billion operating budget for Fiscal Year (FY) 2018. The budget includes a \$64 million increase from FY 2017, which will allow the district to manage significant enrollment growth and build the foundation and structure needed to ensure that all MCPS students are able to achieve at higher levels. The Board's budget request will be submitted to the Montgomery County Executive and the County Council. The County Executive is expected to release his FY 2018 operating budget recommendation by March 15. The Montgomery County Council will hold public hearings on the county budget in April before passing a final budget in May. Stay informed and engaged on the Board's budget request on the MCPS Operating Budget website.

Find out how budget decisions are made, what the county is doing today to get ready for FY 2018 and beyond, and the opportunities residents have to influence budget decisions at upcoming budget meetings with County Councilmember Craig Rice, Superintendent of Schools Jack R. - Pay tribute to your child's school counselor by nominating him or her for the School Counselor of the Year Award. The awards honor the dedication and hard work of counselors one each at the elementary, middle, and high school levels. Parents, students, staff, and administrators can submit nominations. Counselors must be actively working as a counselor in MCPS and have worked for the system for at least three years. Nominees must show outstanding leadership; understand the individual needs of students, encourage their talents and cultivate their self-esteem; foster collaborative relationships with colleagues, students, their families, and the community; and use data to help drive decision-making. Nominations due Friday, March 10. Counselors may be nominated by school administrators, staff members, parents, and students.
