- United We Learn: Combating Hate Through the Arts Contest Combating the elevated levels of divisiveness, prejudice, bias, and hate that have emerged in our county and across the nation is the responsibility of every community member, including students. To help our county combat hate, MCPS in partnership with the Montgomery County Faith Community Working Group, is launching a contest titled: United We Learn: Combating Hate Through the Arts. The goal of the contest is to provide students with a creative, structured opportunity to explore issues of prejudice and learn about the values of respect, diversity, and civility.

The contest is open to students from all grade levels. Students can participate by making a poster, creating multimedia, developing a performance for stage, or through writing. **The deadline for submissions is April 21** and winners will receive prizes. • MCPS Parents Encouraged to Complete Engagement Survey A random sample of families at all grade levels in each MCPS school will be asked to participate in the 2017 Parent

Engagement Survey. Parents who are selected to participate will receive information by mail and are asked to complete the survey online by June 1, 2017. The survey is about your experiences with your child's school and education. Your answers are confidential and are reported with the answers from other families. The information you provide will help schools better understand families' engagement in their children's education and improve connections between schools and families. The survey is brief and can be completed in 10 minutes.

- The spring session of the MCPS Parent Academy has begun. Parent Academy helps equip parents with the tips and tools they need to help their children succeed. All of the workshops are free and are held at schools and other locations throughout Montgomery County. Spring workshops include internet safety, effective parenting strategies, and understanding financial aid. Childcare and interpretation services are provided at all classes. - MCPS has undertaken a thorough review of the fine arts curriculum during the past year. As part of the process, MCPS solicited feedback from stakeholders including arts educators, MCPS students, community members, university and arts organization partners, and the Curriculum Advisory Assembly. The proposed Fine Arts Curriculum Framework:

 (a) aligns with the National Core Arts Standards (NCAS);
 (b) builds upon the experiential knowledge of MCPS teachers and administrators over many years of implementing arts education programs; and
 (c) is consistent with MCPS core values.

The Board of Education has tentatively approved the draft frameworks and MCPS is now seeking public comment on the draft frameworks posted below. Public comment will be open until April 21, 2017. The feedback will be used to make additional revisions to the Frameworks before final approval by the Board in May 2017. - Montgomery County summer camp programs will be extended to support families without childcare options due to the later start time of the school year. This follows the

executive order that Governor Larry Hogan signed last fall, which required Maryland's public schools to start classes after Labor Day, beginning with the 2017–2018 school year. Montgomery County Recreation added more than 40 additional full or half-day programs to effectively serve families due to the later start date for the school year. This included six Summer Fun Centers (SFC), which are the Department of Recreation's most affordable summer day programs. Dear Parents,

We are offering an exciting summer adventure for your child: Camp Bells Mill for our students entering Grades 1-5 in the fall; and KinderCamp for those entering Kindergarten. The camp will be held at Bells Mill ES from July 10 to 28 and will be staffed by our own great teachers. Your student will spend three and a half hours each day having great fun with creative activities that support the MCPS curriculum. Camp hours are 8:30 a.m. – 12:00 noor. (doors open at 8:25 am). Limited bus transportation is available. Children should bring a healthy snack and drink from home. It is important that you are able to commit to sending your child to all 15 days.

Students are offered learning opportunities through arts/crafts, physical education, technology, music, reading, math, science and social studies. All elements of the program support the MCPS curriculum.

Please note that your child must be registered as a Bells Mill student in order to attend. If your child is new to Bells Mill, this means that before your child can attend camp we need your current proof of residency, your child's birth certificate, your photo ID and an up-to-date immunization record.

The fee for attending camp is \$550 per child. There are opportunities to decrease tuition fees based on income eligibility requirements. No student will be denied attendance due to financial constraints. Please contact the office if you would like information on payment options.

Please send \$550 payment (check/money order payable to Bells Mill ES) along with the attached form by Monday, May 22, 2017. We will make room for all Bells Mill students, but it is important that you let us know if your child will be coming so that we can plan staffing and hire the appropriate number of teachers.
