- It is important that parents pay off any negative balances owed to the cafeteria. Please check your child's lunch account balance. The school is obligated to pay any negative balances that remain on the last day of school, so it would be greatly appreciated if you would deposit the amount your child owes for lunches. Now is a good time to deposit enough funds to see your child through this last week of school. Funds left in the account will carry over to next school year.
- This is a reminder to have your student check the lost and found area on the stage for missing items. Small items such as eyeglasses are in the office. Unclaimed clothing will be donated to Goodwill.

- If you wish to honor your child's teacher with an end of year gift, please consider a tax deductible contribution to the Bells Mill Bear Hug Fund. The teacher will receive a card stating that a contribution in their honor has been made by you, and you will receive a receipt acknowledging your tax deductible contribution. - Reminder from the Health Room . . . Your child's medication must be picked up by you or another responsible adult no later than 1:00 pm on Friday, June 16. Any medication left after that time will be destroyed. Medication forms for next year will be provided when you pick up your medication. Medication forms are always available on the MCPS website. - MCPS announced the winners of its first ever United We Learn: Combating Hate through the Arts contest, during the Board of Education's May 22 meeting. The contest was open to students from all grade levels. The categories were: written word, performance, visual art, and video/audio. - Montgomery County Public Libraries (MCPL) invites all students to participate in this year's Summer Reading Program, which will run June 10 to September 10. This year's theme is "Build a Better World." The program features learning activities, book lists, and fun educational events to encourage learning all summer long. Prizes (while supplies last) will also be awarded upon completion of the learning activity tracks. Starting June 10, participants can sign up for the program and keep track of the books they read or have read to them. Registration will be available online and at any MCPL branch library.
- The County Council approved an operating budget for FY 2018. The budget allocates \$2.52 billion to MCPS—a \$62.3 million increase more than the current fiscal year. This budget will allow MCPS to manage enrollment growth and build the foundation and structure needed to ensure that all MCPS students are able to achieve at higher levels. The approved budget includes investments in improving student performance while narrowing achievement gaps. The Board of Education will take final action on the budget on June 13.
