Items of most need are: canned vegetables/fruit /tuna/meats/soups/chili, dried soups, brown rice, rolled oats, quinoa, low sugar/high fiber cereal, plain oatmeal, vegetable oils, evaporated milk, tea, coffee, infant cereals and formulas, crackers, and whole wheat pasta.

Red Ribbon Week is a time when we celebrate making healthy choices. Each student will receive a red ribbon at school on Monday, October 26, to wear throughout the week. Mrs. Kanter has been visiting classrooms to promote healthy choices and to encourage these choices all year long.
