• International Walk to School Day is October 7, 2015. This year Bells Mill is the host school. This means we will welcome county government and police officials to join us as we walk to school. On the morning of October 7, all students will gather between 9:05 and 9:20 at Cabin John Middle School where their teachers will meet them. If your child rides a bus, the bus will drop students off at Cabin John. If you drive or walk to school, you should drop off your student in the Cabin John parent drop off which is off of Gainsborough Rd. Bar-T and Georgetown Hill students will be escorted to Cabin John to meet us. We will begin our walk to school at 9:25. The entire school will walk that morning. Following the walk we will gather on the basketball court where the students will be greeted by school and county officials. If it is raining the greeting at Bells Mill will be moved from the basketball court to the all purpose room. We will walk rain or shine, so please have your child dressed for the weather.

- Beginning Monday, October 5, the Student Government is sponsoring Kids Helping Kids Food Drive to benefit our local Manna Food Center. Please send in donations of nonperishable food to the collection boxes located in the Grade 3/4 hallway. Items of most need include canned vegetables/fruit /tuna/meats/soups/chili, dried soups, brown rice, rolled oats, quinoa, low sugar/high fiber cereal, plain oatmeal, vegetable oils, evaporated milk, tea, coffee, infant cereals and formulas, crackers, and whole wheat pasta.

- Attention parents of students in Gr. 5: November 6 is the application deadline for the Middle School Magnet Programs at Roberto Clemente, Eastern and Takoma Park Middle Schools. Please visit www.montgomeryschoolsmd.org/curriculum/specialprograms for application forms, test preparation materials and a list of dates for important parent meetings. Testing for the middle school magnet application programs will take place on December 5. More information regarding the December 5 testing will be available on the above website after November 6. - Emergency Care for Students Experiencing Anaphylaxis is a MCPS policy to safeguard your children in the event of an emergency. If your child has a known anaphylactic allergy, you are responsible for notifying school of your child's special health care needs and providing appropriate medications to be kept in the school's health room for your child's use in case of an emergency. You must complete MCPS form 525-16, Emergency Care for the Management of a Student with a Diagnosis of Anaphylaxis: Release and Indemnification Agreement for Epinephrine Auto Injector and deliver the properly labeled epinephrine auto-injector to the school nurse. Maryland requires all schools to keep an emergency stock of epinephrine auto-

injectors and designated staff members are trained to administer Epi-Pens. Whenever an auto-injector is used, whether it belongs to your child or is one of the school's supply, 911 and you will be called immediately. Please check backpacks for Mrs. O's letter regarding this policy. Questions, call Mrs. Messina in the health room, 301-469-1250.

- MCPS Parent Academy workshops give parents tips and tools to help their children succeed in school. All workshops are FREE and held at schools and locations throughout the county. October workshops include subjects such as Positive Discipline, Cybersafety, and Homework Hassles, just to name a few. - The Montgomery County Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) will conduct FREE nasal spray flu vaccine clinics (FluMist) in November for children 18 and under at many MCPS schools. On Monday, November 2, 2015, flu clinics will be held at John F. Kennedy, Richard Montgomery, and Seneca Valley high schools from 9 a.m. to noon. No classes will be held on that day because it is a professional day for teachers. These clinics will be open to any school-aged child. Clinics are FREE, but appointments are required due to the limited supply of vaccine. Visit http://www.montgomerycountymd.gov/flu for a complete list of clinics and to make an appointment. Bells Mill will host a FREE flu clinic on Wednesday, November 11, 2015, following 1:20 pm early dismissal of students. Information on scheduling appointments at Bells Mill will be provided when it becomes available. Since our vaccine supply will be limited, we encourage you to take advantage of the high school clinics.
