- Attention parents of 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> graders, in collaboration with MCPS, Saturday School offers MCPS families the opportunity to participate in *PARCC Exposure*, a series of Saturday sessions, beginning March 12, designed to help students become more familiar with taking the Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC) exams this spring. Beginning Saturday, March 12, students will be exposed to the PARCC assessments on computers and Chromebooks. Certified MCPS teachers will reinforce what students are learning during the week. Registration is \$40 for students who receive Free and Reduced-price Meals (FARMS) and \$70 for non-FARMS students. Parents are invited to the March 12 parent training at all 12 Saturday School centers to learn more about the PARCC assessment.
- MCPS parents, students, and staff are encouraged to submit nominations to recognize individuals and programs that have contributed to the success and acceptance of students with special needs. The FY 2017 Operating Budget includes resources to serve more than 2,500 additional students; REDUCE CLASS SIZES; CLOSE THE ACHIEVEMENT GAP; improve students' literacy and math skills; and build the cultural proficiency of staff.
