• I want to take this opportunity to inform pet owners that dogs must be on a leash and under the owner's control at all times. Several parents inquired about school policy regarding dogs and reminded us that some children are not comfortable around animals. Therefore, I am asking for the cooperation of pet owners. If you must bring your dog to school at dismissal, please be considerate and stand away from the front doors so that children can exit the building without encountering your pet.

For you information I have included Montgomery County Code, Chapter Sec. 5-203(a)(7) regarding dogs on public school grounds: An owner must not allow a dog to be on public school grounds on a day when school is in session, or in a public recreation area during an organized activity, unless the dog is controlled by a leash or similar restraining device.

- Bells Mill students on eight teams competed at the Odyssey of the Mind State Tournament on Saturday, March 12. Our school remains the largest Odyssey organization in the state! Of our five Division 1 teams (grades 3-5), two received first place trophies and two received second place trophies to add to Bells Mill's growing collection. These four teams are eligible (and some have already decided to go) to compete at the International World Finals in May, representing Bells Mill and Maryland. Another team received the second place award for the Spontaneity Competition, a very competitive problem-solving competition held in February and awarded this weekend. Finally, a team of Bells Mill fifth graders won the coveted Ranatra Fusca Award for exceptional creativity, an honor so rare it has never been awarded at the Maryland State Tournament before! Congratulations go to all 70 participants in this year's program!
- There will be no school for kindergarteners on Monday and Tuesday, April 11 and 12. On these days we will hold Kindergarten Orientation for next year's kindergarteners.

- All students brought home a blue form that requests your school plans for next year. It is important for staffing that we know how many students will return to Bells Mill. If you have not already done so, please complete the form and return it to your child's teacher.
- At this time of year maintenance personnel begin the process of converting schools from heating to air conditioning. There will be no heat in our building after mid-April. Please keep the weather forecast in mind when dressing your child for school.

- Montgomery County Executive Isiah Leggett has released his recommended operating budget for FY 2017 and is proposing a \$135.9 million increase in spending for MCPS. This is about \$44 million less than the \$2.5 billion operating budget the Board of Education had requested. The Montgomery County Council will hold public hearings on the County Executive's budget recommendation on April 5, 6, and 7. This is an opportunity for parents, staff, students, and community members to share their thoughts with county leaders about why it is important to fully fund the MCPS budget. The meetings will take place from 7 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. on April 6 at Gaithersburg HS; April 18 at Kennedy HS; and May 5 at Walter Johnson HS.
