  - o The new attendance zones for Bethesda-Chevy Chase Middle School #2, which will open in August 2017, and Westland Middle School;
  - Options to address the current short- and long-term projected space deficits in the elementary, middle, and high schools in the Walter Johnson Cluster; and
  - o The relocation of Alternative Education Programs at the Blair G. Ewing Center to supplements to the superintendent's proposed amendments to the current six-year Capital Improvements Program (CIP) for MCPS. The remaining amendments will be sent to the Board of Education on October 27.

Members of the community will have an opportunity to give feedback on the CIP amendments during the Board of Education's public hearings on November 10 and 14.
