Study Released on Career and Technology Education Programs in MCPS

MCPS has released its comprehensive study of Career and Technology (CTE) programs. The study was commissioned by the Board of Education to assess the district's current programs and efforts to prepare all students for non-remedial postsecondary education and high-demand fields of employment.

Over the next several months, MCPS will engage with the community to discuss the report's findings and recommendations and will map out a short- and long-term implementation strategy for the superintendent and Board's consideration.
