What is Model UN?

Model United Nations (Model UN or MUN) is an authentic simulation of the UN General Assembly, UN Security Council, or other multilateral UN body, in which students **act as country delegates** and engage in acts of diplomacy, negotiation, and decision making.

The Model UN Club is administered through **Global Minds, LLC** and registered with **Global Classrooms DC (GCDC)**, the flagship education program of the United Nations Association of the National Capital Area (UNA-NCA), and is part of a nationwide initiative to strengthen relations between the US and the UN. GCDC provides an expansive curriculum curated by partnering UN agencies in the DC area. This year, in order to reach the needs of students during the pandemic, students will have access to an online curriculum, virtual workshops, virtual guest speakers and a virtual Model UN conference in the Fall.

What do Students Learn?

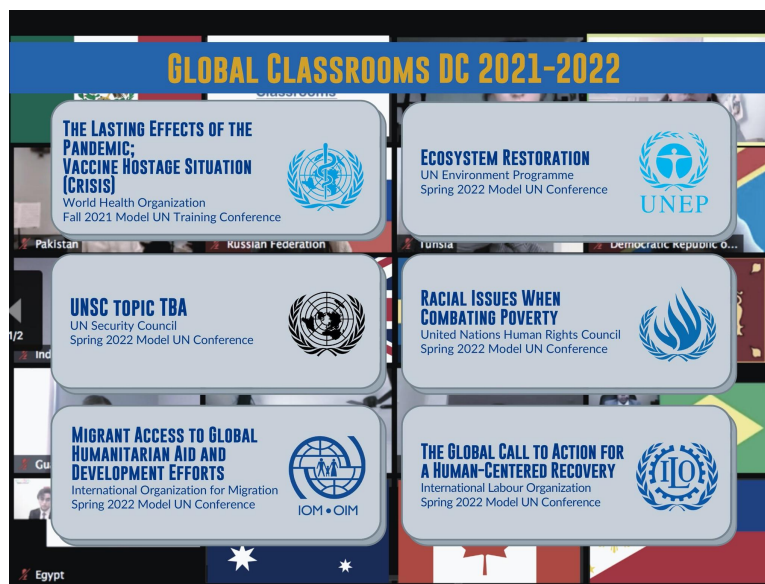

The GCDC Fall 2020 Model UN Training Conference will take place virtually via Zoom Thursday, November 18 in partnership with the Pan American Health Organization. The conference will provide an opportunity for newcomers to Model UN to participate in a conference designed to teach rather than compete. Students who have previous Model UN experience will benefit from practicing current skills.



This year's Fall conference will feature the World Health Organization in which students will discuss the topic of "*The Lasting Effects of the Pandemic; Vaccine Hostage Situation*" and five other UN committees during the Spring Conference .

The GCDC Spring conference will likely take place in April of 2022. In years past, the competitive Spring conference has been hosted at the U.S. Department of State in Washington D.C. As conditions around the pandemic unfold, details about how the Spring conference will be conducted will be shared.

In addition to the two conferences hosted by GCDC, our club seeks out additional conference opportunities hosted by neighboring high schools and universities. As these become available, we will share these opportunities with parents and students.
